## Article 13

Children have the right to share freely with others what they learn, think and feel by talking, drawing, writing or in any other way unless it harms other people.

# Rules of Article 13

This is due on Tuesday the 8<sup>th</sup>

There doesn't have to be 3 rules but there has to be at least 1

1. Everyone has the right to share their opinions as to how they feel about playground games, and they have the choice of whether or not to join in - no-one can be forced to play a game when they don't want to.
2. To share information about any games we are playing freely so as people can decide whether they want to join in or not.
3. To share resources freely with one another and no bullying others.
